

# Geo-Communication for a Healthy Ageing Society

This project aims at the autonomous development of local societies in sustainable ecosystems. We aim to accumulate local, regional and historical information on nature and society, analyze active elements in dynamic networks, and visualize the network systems geographically. These systems will support action research aimed at improving human well-being.

Humans (A01) and regional resources (A02) will be analyzed historically, medically and geographically over the 'longue durée'. The establishment of new regional information systems (A03) will combine this historical knowledge and evidence with action research (A04-4/5), and these can be expected to support the realization of human well-being and the sustainability of natural and social localities.

I have introduced our new research project. As well as this, several social researchers from Chiang Mai University and Kagawa University have discussed further possibilities for collaboration in the future. Such multidimensional issues dealing with a 'Healthy Ageing Society' will be an ideal platform for the focus of our research from now on.
